Want a Winter Shoot? Try Mushrooms

Get out your reflectors and right-angle-viewfinders. Now is a good time to look for mushrooms. Fall, winter and spring are the best times for mushrooms. Mushrooms are classified as fungi along with Slime Moles, Bread Moles and others. They have no roots, stems or leaves, and they cannot make their own food like plants can. They live on other dead or living

things. Athlete's Foot is a fungus that lives on humans. Forests (Pine, Oak or Redwood) floors are great places to find photogenic mushrooms (Macro fungi). Some mushrooms such as the Aminita Death Caps and the Aminita Panther Mushrooms are extremely poisonous! But others such as the Pink Coral Mushrooms and the Inky Caps (or Shaggy Mane) mushrooms are very good eating. Only experienced mushroom hunters should try to find and eat wild mushrooms. The rest of us should get ours from Safeway & Raleys. The "mushrooms" that we see are actually the fruit of the mushroom. The mycelium (primitive root like structures) are the actual organism itself. Mushrooms and other fungi play a very vital role in turning fallen trees and branches back into soil. Many of our mushrooms make for beautiful photographic images. Reflectors and right-angle viewfinders make it much easier to photograph mushrooms. Folsom Lake is a good place to start looking for mushrooms. "Happy mushroom hunting to you!" Guidelines for Competition

Nature Competition generally follows the guidelines set forth by the Photographic Society of America known as PSA. Images should tell a "nature story". They should not include human elements, man-made objects, domestic animals, cultivated plants, mounted specimens, derivations or manipulations that alter the content

Guidelines for Code of Practice

The Nature Division of the Photographic Society of America, in order to help protect all nature subjects and the environment, has adopted a Code of practice as a guide-line for all photographers to follow.

General Guidlines

Always be considerate of your subjects, be they animal, vegetable or mineral. Killing or injuring any living thing is not a proper part of our nature photography.

For the good name of nature photography, observe normal courtesies. Permission should be obtained before trespassing on land on which there is not customarily free access. Be courteous to your fellow photographer.

Be familiar with the life history and the geographic or geologic setting of your subject. The more complex the life form and rarer the species, the greater your knowledge, care and respect should be.

Abide by all requests of rangers and wardens in national and State Parks and wildlife refuges.
