Winter rains got you down? Try some tabletop! I've been shooting flowers and dried grasses. You don't need a studio---I'm using a table near a window in our spare bedroom. When the sun is not shining through the window, or when there is no sun at all, I have nice soft, even light. You can shoot pieces of fruit or veggies, maybe with a macro lens. Or anything else around the house. You'll probably need a tripod. Also, I found

some fall leaves covered with dewdrops. The dewdrops magnify the texture of the leaf. Cool! I macro'd them on my back porch. On the other hand, you can get out in the mud and shoot fungus. They're all over the place, probably including yards in your neighborhood. Point Reyes is especially nice for fungi at this time of year, but you have to find them. Ask someone in the Nature Division where the hot spots are. And of course, this is the time to visit the bird refuges. It takes a little patience to shoot birds. Drive into the refuge and stop when you find an area that looks hopeful. Often it's best to stay in the car because it acts as a blind. Open your window and use the window frame to prop up your camera. Chico has a Snow Goose Festival in late January. Info at 800-825-8570, ext 313.

Charlie Willard, Travel Co-Director


