We are in need of someone to be the Director of our Tuesday meetings. Its been called "Digital", "Color" and "Open". There is no a distinctive category. The images can be anything including Black and White. This year the print division has also been held at this meeting.

Here's what's involved in being Director: Plan the meetings: Competition? Workshop? Show and tell? Guest speaker? Contact people to present workshops or make other presentations. Attend the meetings or get someone to stand in for you, and run the meetings.

For competitions, make sure you have a judge, record all scores and recognize everyone who scored a twelve. (You can get help finding judges).

For the Gammagram, write a brief article each month announcing what's coming up and reporting scores after competition nights.

Attend Board meetings (six or eight per year).

You will have help from previous Directors, Board

members and club members.

If you have any questions, call Dolores (or me, after October 17).

Here's the biggie: If we don't have a Director, we can't have the meetings! And the meetings are the heart of the Club! So please support the club and help us.

October events: the Travis Air Show is usually in October. Did you catch the one at Mather? Wow! Travis is even better. Now's the time to start making your holiday greeting cards. Fall color will be showing up by the end of October or early November. Try Grass Valley and Nevada City: picturesque towns plus fall color. And while you're there, try the Empire Mine State Park. Farther afield, the Eastern Sierra will also be showing fall colors. Take any of the roads west from Highway 395. Hard to predict exactly when the colors will peak and then that time will be brief. Go to <calphoto.com> and click on Fall Foliage Hotsheet. This source often has upto-date info on fall color locations, as well as wildflowers.

Digital Report by Dolores Frank, Digital Chair

Our September meeting gave us an opportunity to become better photographers.

Our thanks to Byron Hindman for offering some of the most thoughtful judging we have had in a while. It isn't necessary to agree with his choices. What is really important is to pay attention to some of the comments he made. This is not advice for new members only; we can all become better photographers by heeding some of his advice. I hope I am able to convince you to pay attention to some of the following:

Create the illusion of a 3rd dimension. A good way to do this is to have something up close in a scene. (Check out a lot of Truman's wide angle images on his web site for excellent examples - www.abiphotos.com).

If you are putting a "border" around your digital image, make the tone of it fit the image, and make it narrow. Some images which did not have any pure white in the image had a border which was pure white and white pulls the eye away from the focal point of the image.

Check your image carefully for distractions. If there is an "odd" thing on the edge of the image, get it out of there.

If you are going to present a flower, make it a really good

specimen. It is a rare photo which can handle a dying flower...but, it can be done. For the most part, if you want to do flowers, make it the best of the species you can find. It is a good start for a winner.

Simplicity My personal biggest challenge is to find simple lines or designs or images. They can become your best winners. Keep it simple works.

Don't forget to check your contrast. Some images just need a boost.

Watch out for those hot spots in your image. This is basic stuff and yet, we continue to see these very bright areas in images. Tone them down, or crop them out. You are working on the computer and you can do this.

Remember. The reason we are getting together with judges is so we can learn how to do it better. The judge may not select the image you would have selected...or, he may have made a comment with which you do not agree. That's fine. Just take from it what you find useful and forget the rest. Make yourself the winner.

We had a good time last evening and I'm proud of all of the work that is submitted for competitions. Keep up the good work.

Nature/Travel Report by Donna Sturla, Nature Chair

We had a great Nature competition on Wednesday, September 16th, with judge Susan Bovey. Congratulations to Willis Price for his Image of the Month, entitled "Egret with Reflection". I notice that many of you did not submit images, so if you want to be "in the running" for the end of the year, we only have one competition left and it will be in November. I have noted who needs makeups so please get those shutters clicking!

For the October meeting, we will have an educational class which will be directed at Travel Photography but




