



March 29-30: Tulip Festival, Nice. Tulip Hill Winery and Vineyards (707) 274-9373. Food, music, tasting (careful---you need to hold that camera steady) and maybe 50,000 tulips in bloom. I don't know anything about this but it sounds worth exploring.

Butte County has a blossom tour (orchards) that's usually in early March. Call the Chico Chamber of Commerce, 800-852-8570

And it's time to crank up for the wildflower season. Dust off that macro lens; do those deep knee bends; a little yoga won't hurt. Head up in the foothills later in March, and don't forget local areas such as along the American River. I always find poppies along the levee. The City Cemetery should have good flowers as well. Also, the vernal pools at Mather Field and out of Dixon at Jepson Prairie. If you're lucky you might find two "bathtub rings" of different colored flowers around the same pool. Cool! Lots of belly flowers, so wear your kneeling pants. Call me if you need directions.
