## Tip of the Month.

To stroke an image in Photoshop: Select all and then go to Edit and find Stroke. Decide on the color of your stroke by clicking on the "color" box and select a color and say ok. Then, decide if you want the stroke to be 2 or 3 or more pixels. You have three choices ...inside or center or outside and also opacity. I usually leave opacity at $100 \%$. Experiment with the center, outside and inside choices and select the one you prefer. Also, keep in mind this works best and easiest on a flattened image.
