General Photography Division News Grant Kreinberg and Chuck Pivetti, Co-directors

May Meeting

Our May meeting was our first Advanced Photoshop workshop since our new General Photography Division was created at the beginning of the year. You should have learned what the Layers Panel is all about, what adjustment layers and their masks can do, how to make mirror images, and how to composite three or four photos into one like this.



Our Next Meeting is June 8

At our June meeting we will be sharing. There will be no judge to critique your work or assign it a score. We will just ask for comments from the floor. Here's your chance to be daring; show us that picture that you think is creative and imaginative but you're not sure what a judge would score it. Show a new technique you've developed, or a new shooting location you've discovered. Send two digital images to Chuck Pivetti in the size and format you would use for competition.

In July there will be another workshop on Advanced Photoshop techniques. You have over a month to think about what you'd like to see demonstrated and let Grant and Chuck know. Probably the next important subject to cover should be retouching portraits. Cameras, especially with flash, are not kind to the human face, and there are some simple techniques to correct the camera's cruelty. Red-eye and lash burn are a couple of the most common problems when shooting people with flash; both are quite easy to correct.

Tip of the Month From Chuck Pivetti

There's no way to save a JPEG image that has been modified without causing a loss of picture quality due to JPEG compression. However, if you open a JPEG image in Photoshop and then close it again without making any changes, there will be no additional loss. So, if you shoot JPEG in your camera (and I strongly recommend that you do not if your camera supports TIFF or RAW), make sure when you work on your pictures that you rename them and save them in a new folder. And, if you are not happy with your remake, throw it away, go back to the camera original and work on it again. Avoid opening, reworking, and re-saving the same JPEG.

Rah! Rah! for RAW. It's impossible to degrade the RAW file formatted by your camera, because you cannot write to that RAW file. When opened in Adobe Camera Raw, cropping, re-sizing, sharpening, adding contrast, increasing clarity, adding saturation, spotting, removing sensor dust, applying graduated tonal corrections, correcting lens vignetting and aberration, etc. results in no changes to the RAW file. Well, what goes on then? What happens is that all these adjustments are written to a sidecar file as instructions on how to correct the Preview images and what to do when you open the file in Photoshop. And when that edited RAW file is opened in Photoshop, it cannot be saved as a RAW file; it must be saved in one of the other formats provided by Photoshop such as PSD, TIFF, or JPEG; again ensuring the integrity of your original file.
