On December 19, former SCC member Nelda Brandenburger Hanson passed away at the age of 92 Nelda was a wonderful photographer active in the former creative division of SCC and was also an officer on the board. She was an avid supporter of music and art in the Sacramento community and helped found the Sacramento Symphony in the early 1960s. She was one of a group of women photographers known as Ten Eyes and her outstanding photo images were on display at various galleries In SCC, she made a couple offield trips to Donner Lake possible, where members stayed at their family resort Loch Leven Lodge for weekends of fall photography. She accompanied Lila and others on a "Snowfari" winter trip to the Tetons and Yellowstone. She is remembered as very talented, energetic, generous and thoughtful. She has been missed in recent years due to the devastating illness Alzheimer's. We extend sympathy to her daughter, former member Linda Brandenburger, and the rest of her family. "Nelda, now you can join with the others who have left us and continue taking pictures for the Heavenly club'. Remembrances may be directed to a fund in the name of Nelda and Samuel Hanson at the Crocker Art Museum Foundation.
