Tip of the month: Do not include large areas of empty sky or water in your photos, and avoid placing the horizon in the middle of the image unless there is a compelling reason to do so.

Did anyone notice how Truman Holtzclaw is charging ahead this year? He's only one point off a perfect score for the year to date. Not bad. Laurie Friedman is starting off with an impressive show of strength, too. It will be interesting to see who ends the year with the highest total score.

But then in the long run, everybody wins. Everybody who enters slides has an opportunity to see how to improve her/his photography. The main purpose of the evaluation should be to teach us how to be better photographers.

Perhaps the most useful is: www.calphoto.com/wflower.htmor just www.calphoto.com This is a site for photographers. People e-mail in what they've found, so it's relevant and current. www.cnps.org California Native Plant Society; Click on Links, bottom left of home page. Lots of general info on Califwildflowers and useful links. Also try these (Thanks to Bill Clark for suggesting them): http://natureali.orgMostly Kern, Inyo and Tulare counties; look for Sierra Nevada.

http:/www.marin.cc.ca.us/cnpsMarin County but flower names are in Latin. Also, you can do searches for California Wildflowers, etc.

Now for a couple of books that specify locations, flowers and approximate dates: Wildflower Walks and Roads of the Sierra Gold Country by Toni Fauver, Comstock Bonanza Press. Excellent coverage of the foothills. Also, Carol Leigh has a comprehensive guide to California wildflowers that you can buy on her website, www.calphoto.com. It covers the whole state and she is a photographer. It's a CD ROM; I don't know if she still publishes it in book form.

Locations: always a gamble but here are some suggestions: Highway 49 and the roads that wander in the foothills around it. Mitchell Canyon on Mt. Diablo: In Walnut Creek, take Ygnacio Valley Road east, right on Clayton, then right on Mitchell Canyon Rad. There's a fee for parking. China Camp state park in Marin County Pt. Reyes, although it can be windy there. Duncan's Landing. One of my favorites on the coast. As many flowers as Pt. Reyes, complete wih parking near the flowers and a bathroom! It's on Highway 1 a little north of Bodega Bay. P.S.: There's a state campground just north of it. Bear Valley, northwest of Williams. There are several roads in. Because of all the rain some may be very muddy. Therefore I recommend the road out of Maxwell. This is a full-day trip and there's no bathroom there. (But we're used to that) Vernal pools at Jepson Prairie. Go down 80 to Dixon, south on 113 right through Dixon and on for about 13 miles. When the highway takes a hard left you go straight. You'll see the parking area shortly.

Not into flowers? Shame on you! On the first weekend in May Stoneyford (also out of Maxwell) will have a parade and rodeo. Verify date and time before you go. Also, West Sacramento has its Fifteen Days in May photo contest. It is fun and local.
