PHOTO OPS January 2006 Bob Hubbell 383-5188

Oak trees! They will have no leaves now and make wonderful silhouettes. Try Scott Road, south of Highway 50 near Folsom, or wander around in the countryside. January and February are great bird months. The closest sanctuary is right at the west end of the causeway over the Yolo Bypass; exit just west of the causeway, go south under the freeway, take gravel road on your left over the levee (unless it is flooded...) Other refuges: Colusa and Sacramento out I-5, and Grey Lodge off Highway 99 near Gridley. Bird watchers recommend you stay in your car and shoot out the window--the car works as a blind---but if you want to get out on your feet there are official trails at both Sacramento and Grey Lodge. Not into nature photography? Get art shots of flying birds at slow shutter speeds (bracket around 1/15). Stormy weather? Shoot those clouds. Also, mushrooms often come up right after rain. Look for them everywhere, evenin your own yard. Fog? More art shots, especially at night with glistening streets and fog lit by streetlights and neons.
