#### **April Meeting**

Well, once again we had some terrific pictures! I never tire of looking at this club's work. And it's great to see really good work in the beginning classes; April Slide of the Month went to someone in Class B.

Marquita Plomer, owner of Camera Arts, was our judge. Marquita who works with commercial, fineart, and student photographers in her daily businessbrings a fresh approach to camera club judging. In evaluating 68 slides, she gave a full range of scores in each class. She awarded honors to the following eighteen entries:

Slide-of-the-Month was "Spring in the Foothills" by Bob Ashley. Bob says he liked his other entry better. And that just illustrates how subjective we are when we look at photographs. Sometimes we will have a judge who explains his criteria for evaluating and scoring images who then goes on to award Slideof-the-Month honor to an image that goes totally against his criteria.

Good judges will consider exposure, focus, composition, contrast, color, storytelling, and all the other elements of photographic technique. But images that consistently win honors have visual and emotional impact.

Ron Parker's fifty-character title, "Female Mountain Goat and Kid Bedding on a Snow Patch," takes the Writer's Cramp Trophy away from Bill Manasse who won last month Carol Jordan with "Grapes" and Donna Sturla with "Alaska" each get a "thank you" from the recording table.

Tip of the month: Watch those edges. This month a beautiful image lost points because just a hint of a chair was showing at the upper right edge. Also, avoid bright high lights at the edges; they can be very distracting.

Truman Holtzclaw is holding that over all lead. His 94 points is only two off a perfect total. Susan Nielsen, Willis Price, and Gail Parris are all over 90. So, if you are having trouble scoring, you might pay very close attention to what these experienced photographers are doing.

#### Class Reassignment

A new member, Theo Benson, brought two slides and asked if he could enter them into the judging. He said he was an experienced photographer who is now doing professional photography, so we entered his slides in Class AAAA. One, an interesting color infrared shot of the San Diego Presidio, earned an honor. The other scored ten points.

If Theo were allowed to bring in make-ups and catch up with the Class AAAA group, we could move somebody up to Top Ten to replace Melba Cerrutti, who dropped out, and still have four competitors in Class AAAA. If there are objections to this bending of the make-up rules, please let me know.

The next highest Class AAAA scorer at the end of last year would then move up to Top Ten. That person was Jim Cehand.
