Christmas Cards & Holiday Greeting cards: Now's the time to start working on them. Your friends and relatives will be pleased that you cared enough to send better than the very best. There are commercial "kits" available for making cards the easy way---You just add your picture. Or, you can do it all yourself. If you wantt to know one way to do it yourself, ask me. Remember, though, no matter how you do it, it will take longer than you think.

Foothill communities may be good for fall color now. Nevada City is a good choice. The Apple Hill area might be good. Ask for a map at the first place you visit. Be careful because the roads are narrow. Dutch Flat and Iowa Hill are other good choices: cemeteries, old buildings, street trees, court house. Sac State has lots of trees that turn around now. Parking is not patrolled on Sundays, but on other days you need to buy a one-day parking permit. Also, Capitol Park just east of the Capitol in downtown should have some nice trees turning. Sundays you don't need to feed the parking meters.

Assignment: Get ready for rainy days, reflections on wet streets, etc. Start making a "raincoat" for your camera. A plastic bag works well if it's transparent enough that you can see through the camera's eyepiece. Cut a hole in the other end that just fits your lens and hold the bag on with your sunshade. Or, a gaiter works pretty well. We're talking hikers' gaiters, not alligators. Heads up for next month: The motorcycle toy run happens in early December. Check the Bee or phone the Modified Motorcycle Association or maybe the city chamber of commerce for the date and location.
