We have the summer off, with our next competition on September 7th, with Rich Myron judging. Marcia has graciously agreed to direct the competition, as I will be in the far reaches of Eastern Canada.

PRINT DIVISION Bob Hubbell

The Prints Division had its third workshop on July 25. Considering that it's the middle of summer and very hot, it was well attended with about 20 people. Bob Hubbell presented the workshop. He unveiled some useful aspects of Quick Masks, and even showed one image with a selection problem that no one could really solve completely. He also introduced Layer Masks, a very useful tool to master. Finally, he woke everybody up with a new way to create watercolors out of regular images. Exciting stuff! Our next workshop will be in November, when we will explore using Layer Masks to expand dynamic range (too broad a range from bright to dark in the same image). Our September 26 meeting will be our final competition. Be there or lose your focus.

ELECTRONIC DIVISION Chuck Pivetti

The Electronic Imaging Division will meet on August 8. We will enter two images each for judging (check to see if you need makeups).

Immediately after the judging, there will be a follow-up to June's Basic Digital Photography workshop for those who want to stay. We will cover digital workflow: the first few steps you take after you download your photos into the computer.

A "traditional" destination for August: wildflowers at Carson Pass. There's a trail that leads to Winnemucca Lake. Ask at the ranger station at the pass for details. You'll see the parking area right before the pass. The hike isn't long but the elevation is around 8,000 feet. With the wet winter we had there should be lots of flowers but check before going because I was just at Mt. Lassen, about the same elevation, and there was too much snow for many flowers. Also on Highway 88 but lower elevation look for Indian Grinding Rock State Park and the town of Volcano. Below that are the mother lode towns of Sutter Creek and Jackson. Or, go on over Carson Pass, turn south on Highway 89 to Markleeville and visit Grover Hot Springs St. Park.

Want to stay home? Don't forget the California State Fair in late August and Early September. Lots of baby animals, horse shows, etc. Stay in the evening to shoot the carnival area (daylight setting or film works fine for all those neons) and the fireworks.

Another local place worth visiting is the city cemetery at Broadway and Riverside. Lots of flowers, gravestones, etc.

Want to beat the heat? Plan a day at Angel Island. Take the ferry from Tiburon and bring a picnic lunch. There are historic buildings and, if the weather cooperates, great views of San Francisco. An of course, there's always Pt. Reyes, Monterey, Mendocino . . .

PHOTO TIPS

Bob Hubbell shared a fun and easy tip for watercolor type photos using Photoshop at his latest workshop! Other tips can be found at www.shootsmarter.com

- 1. Open image
- 2. Go to
 - **♥**Image
 - Duplicate. Use duplicated image to complete watercolor work. Close the original image.
- 3. Go to [tool bar at top of program]
 - **∜**Image
 - Canvas size (Alt/Ctrl/c)
 - Increase canvas size by 1 inch on each side
- 4. In the tool bar, select the Art History Brush
 - Adjust the brush size to 100 px diameter [tool bar at top of program]
- 5. Wave the "brush" over the image while holding the mouse. This will dramatically change the look of the image to reflect a fuzzy watercolor look.
- 6. Now adjust the brush size to a smaller diameter. (Try 10 px diameter)
 - Wave the "brush" over the image again while holding the mouse. This will bring back the detail.
 - *Note: Large brush size = fuzzy appearance. Small brush size = restores detail.
- 7. Experiment with this and there is no end to the looks you can create.
