# PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE Bob Hubbell

Best wishes for a wonderful and photo-perfect 2007! Much to tell you about:

1. Camera Arts Photo Exhibit. Sierra Camera Club will have a show at Camera Arts during February and March. They will have wall space for about 20 16X20 framed images; more that that if they are smaller sizes. All Sierra Camera Club members are invited to participate. If you do not print your own images, you may have a print commercially made at Costco or elsewhere. All images must be matted and framed.

Our problem in organizing this is that we don't know many prints we'll end up with. Therefore, if you will be submitting a print, please inform me by January 12 (383-5188; <a href="https://hubjo@sbcglobal.net">hubjo@sbcglobal.net</a>). I need to know the outside dimensions of the frame so that we can estimate how many prints we'll have room for. If more prints are submitted than there is space for, we'll have to drop some out but don't let that discourage you from participating. We have a proud photographic tradition and we want all our divisions represented.

In the middle of January I will inform you whether or not there will be room on Camera Arts' walls to include your print. Here are the particulars:

- 1) All images must be in metal frames (This is because of how Camera Arts hangs them; Camera Arts will give club members 10% off on metal frame kits.)
- 2) Maximum outside size = 16X20; recommended minimum size = 11X14 (Smaller sizes tend to get lost on the wall.)
- 3) Wire not necessary but no need to remove it if it's already there.
- 4) On the back of the image, put: Title of image; Your name, address and phone number; Price if it is for sale. Camera Arts will take 15% any sales; (That's generous.) If you don't wish to sell, simply put NFS.
- 5) Bring the print directly to Camera Arts (712 57th St., off H St.) any time from Feb. 5 9. Not before then, not after then.
- 6) The show will end on April 7. Pick up your prints between April 9 and 13.

Finally, save the evening of February 10. As part of Sacramento's Second Saturday Art Walks, Camera Arts will have a reception showcasing our work. Be there! Got an image you're proud of? Now's you chance to show it to the world!

2. Awards Banquet. There's still time to send a check to our treasurer, Glen Cunningham, to join us for dinner and presentation of awards to the winners. These are your fellow camera nuts; help celebrate their talents and enjoy a dinner with friends.

- 5. Photo Ops. Now that I've taken on the President's duties, I will not be able to continue the Photo Ops column . . . but you can. If you know of a good location or event, e-mail it to Heather as a Photo Op and she can put it in the Gammagram. Jim White has done this a couple times with excellent suggestions. Everybody has a favorite place. Tell us about it!

### MEETING SCHEDULE REORGANIZED!

In 2007 we will have three---count 'em, three---Divisions, as follows:

Digital Division and Business Meetings: Meets the second Tuesday of the month, every month except December when we have our Christmas Party. Chuck Pivetti will continue as Director. This division was called the "Electronic Division", following Photographic Society of America nomenclature, but all of us have always referred to it as "digital", so the Board adopted that term. Our Business Meetings will be held on these same nights, as they always have been.

Slide Division: This division will encompass the former Color Division, Nature Division, and Travel division. Hope Price will continue as Director. Meetings are scheduled for Feb 1, Apr 5, May 3, June 7, Sep 6 and Nov 1.

Print Division: The Print Division will remain unchanged, having recently undergone a major shift to workshops. Bob Hubbell will direct the workshops and Barbara Jones will direct the competitions. Meetings will be on the odd months of the year, on the fourth Tuesdays.

Why make these changes? First, the Board is responding to comments from members. Increasingly people want to expand participation beyond competition. It's not that we are eliminating competition; rather, we are in creasing the number of non-competitive Club activities that members may participate in. Second, we want to follow the trend we see in our members: A growing number of folks are interested only in digital photography; obviously, we must recognize this trend in our Club activities. At that same time, we have a number of people who love slides and we want to offer them a Division where they will feel at home. Finally, the Board has a fiscal responsibility to control the number of meeting nights we need to rent rooms for. If we can combine small divisions, that saves us money. The Garden and Arts Center is very accommodating but they have their own budgetary challenges.

#### COMPETITION RULES REVISED

Our Competition Rules have been revised. In fact, we are calling them "Guidelines" rather than "Rules". The reason for these changes is to allow our Divisions more flexibility in the competitions and workshops that they offer. As stated above, the Board has to be mindful of the membership's interests, and increasingly they are trending away from a club that concentrates primarily on competition.

# **Changes in Slide Competition Meeting Dates**

As more of our camera club members make the switch from film to digital cameras, the number of competitors continue to decline in all of our slide divisions. In an effort to regain the interest of our club members in competing with slide transparences all of the slide divisions will meet on the same night, starting on **February 1st.** That includes Color Pictorial, Nature, Photo Travel, and Photo Travel Sequence slides. Please keep in mind that while digital projection of images have made improvements, it still has along way to go to offer the same quality as Color Slides. Today's digital projectors require that the image file size be compressed to a size so small that the projected images looses detail in both the highlights and the shadows, and not in any way will it produce the quality that we have enjoyed viewing 35mm transparences. Also keep in mind that you can still achieve quality projected images from your digital camera by having your images converted to color slides that can be made using a Film Recorder.

PRINT DIVISION

DIGITAL IMAGE DIVISION Chuck Pivetti

The *last ever* Electronic Imaging Division meeting was way back in October, 2006. But don't worry, we're going to keep right on digitizing.

In 2007 we are looking at some exciting changes. You may recall as the year 2006 was drawing to a close, the Board of Directors asked the membership for authority to make some big changes in the way the club does business. Primarily, the Board wanted to place a little less emphasis on competition and a little more emphasis on learning about photography and all the new stuff that we can have fun with.

The Electronic Imaging Division is changing its name to "Digital Image Division." After all, that's what we have all been calling it in spite of PSA's use of the term "Electronic Imaging." (I know, most people call it simply the "Digital" Division, and that's okay, too. The Board just wanted to be grammatically consistent with images, slides, and prints.)

Also, we are taking over the top spot on the second Tuesday of each month, the Club's general meeting night. Color Slides has moved to join with Nature and Travel Slides on first Thursday nights in February, April, May, June, September, and November.

The Competition Rules are going to allow the Divisions some discretion, and their name has been changed. A new document called "Guidelines for Club Activities" includes guidelines for competition.

So, in view of all this, our first meeting in 2007 on the night of January 9 (just ten days away) will be a workshop. Part of that workshop will be on the new guidelines. Then we will do a little more tedium on digital workflow. And then we'll try to get to something more exciting like using an adjustment layer and layer mask to create a graduated neutral density filter in Photoshop.

For our second meeting of the year on February 13, let us each submit two images for scoring. Also as an assigned subject, please bring in an image that demonstrates a digital editing technique that you would be willing to discuss.
