Have you been to the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament downtown, 11th and J Sts? It's gorgeous inside. Of course, you don't want to intrude during a wedding or other service. Call first 444-3071. Tripods are allowed. Go on a sunny day and the inside is beautifully lit. November means Apple Hill. Drive up Highway 50 past Placerville. You'll see the signs, or take the Camino exit. Pick up a map at the first place you stop. Visit High Hill Farm, which usually has lots of interesting opportunities for photos. Watch for the little things, like a pile of colorful gourds or a child with an apple fritter. (Invest in your fat-for-the-month with a fritter yourself.) According to last year's Bee, there is a great Thanksgiving Day parade in Loomis. Local color. Check before you go. The sandhill cranes are back. Call Bruce Foreman 916-358-2353 for a tour November through February. Bring your longest lens and prepare to shoot at dusk. The yearly motorcycle toy run is either in late November or early December: Google "toy run Sacramento" or <a href="www.maweb.org">www.maweb.org</a>. Find out where their staging area is this year (it varies). You can wander around, shooting choppers of every description, often with giant dolls tied on them, and lots of interesting people.


