The classics are in October, along Hwy 395, especially Lundy Creek, Bishop Creek, the June Lakes Loop, and just about any road leading west up into the Eastern Sierras. Convict lake has an easy walking trail all the way around and a chance for reflections in the early morning. Take some time in Bodie while you are in the neighborhood. Trees along the western slope will be changing too but the best aspens are farther east. Also, toward the middle or end of October, try the Nevada City area and Empire Mine. The Quincy area is another good bet.
