

Bio: Arik Gorban

Arik is an active member of PSA (Photographic Society of America), and is a photographer with a wide variety of interests who focuses on the creative aspects of photography. He frequently judges photo contests, presents programs, exhibits his work, and conducts photo workshops. Arik is the recipient of many photography awards, and his work and articles have been published widely. Website: www.agphotoworks.com

Personally, I have sat in on a few of Arik's programs, and been both informed and impressed by his work and his easy way of sharing.

Visualization and Photo Evaluation

In this program Arik shares ideas and images that will encourage you to explore photo opportunities around your home or while traveling. The presentation focuses on creative seeing and understanding of what it takes to make engaging and interesting photographs. This is an interactive program that starts with a presentation of key considerations of the elements of a good photograph followed by an interactive review and critique of a few images, helping you to take a critical look at your own work as well as the work of other photographers.

Photographing People

In this program you'll see how to take better pictures of people, whether these are formal portraits, family and kids, group shots, or informal pictures of people. The discussions will cover some camera controls, artificial lighting, posing individuals and groups, getting the right expressions, working with various light conditions such as mid-day sun, working in low light, and understanding white balance.

7 July 2022 Program: Comparative Post-Processing

The club experimented with a new program format based on an idea originally suggested by Jan Lightfoot: have different people post-process the same raw starting image and compare and discuss their results. Gert van Ommering organized that idea into a program and provided three raw images that had potential for interesting treatments but clearly needed some significant work to get to a good final image. That set the stage for a high probability of a wide range of approaches and end results.

Seven members submitted their individual take on the three images and, during the meeting, described the approaches, styles, creative perspectives, tools and techniques they used to come up with their unique individual edited images. This became a spirited, fun and informative discussion and sharing of ideas, just what we hoped would happen. We learned about some plugins and other techniques and applications that we all could use to up our post-processing game a bit. We think we will do this again and encourage additional members to participate.

The images below illustrate the diversity of approaches applied to one of the three raw images that led to an interesting diversity in results.



Doug Arnold applied contrast, B&W and the Flood plugin to put the scene at the water's edge



Donna Sturla included grass and subjects from other images to create a fun and bright scene



The original: flat, too symmetrical and shadowed, but has textures colors, and details to be exploited



Robert Benson zoomed in on the interesting details and markings around the door hasp and padlock



Gert van Ommering focused on bringing out the barely visible words on the window shutters



Truman Holtzclaw amped up colors, nixed the symmetry, and applied other creative effects



Evan Wong applied a Lighting Live effect to add amazing detail and highlights to the brick wall



Jan Lightfoot eliminated the symmetry and emphasized the color and textural contrasts
